What is Youth Tour?

The Washington, D.C., Rural Electric Youth Tour is a week-long expenses-paid trip during which approximately 1,500 students from across the country gather at the nation's capital to learn more about government and rural electrification and tour historic sights.

Who is eligible?

Any high school junior whose parents or guardians are members of First Electric may submit an application to enter the Youth Tour contest.
